




WHAT'S IN THE LOGO

The graceful loops in our logo capture the unique textures and the neverbefore-seen designs we craft in close collaboration with you.





"ORIGAMI" Dyeing

Blending traditional **Japanese artistry** and **modern textile innovation**, the "secret" Origami dyeing technique unfolds in four meticulous steps:

- **1. Fabric Preparation**: the knitwear is pre-washed and conditioned to ensure it absorbs the dye evenly.
- 2. Precision Folding: inspired by Origami techniques, skilled artisans fold the fabric into precise geometric shapes. These folds act as a resist barrier, control where the dye penetrates and create distinct, playful patterns.
- **3. Dye Application**: the folded fabric is placed in a small wood frame and immersed in specially formulated dye baths. Exposed areas absorb the dye richly, while the **folded sections retain a lighter hue or their original shade.** This interaction yields a striking contrast that balances boldness with subtlety.
- **4. Unfolding and Finishing**: after the dye has set, the fabric is carefully rinsed and dried. When unfolded, the hidden designs emerge an intricate interplay of colour and shape that reflects both the precision of origami and the creative spontaneity of textile art.






Traditional AIZOMÉ technique is 100% natural and requires meticulous craftsmanship to produce eight deep shades of indigo, renowned for their richness, durability, and purity.

THE PROCESS

- Indigo plants are cultivated locally without any pesticide
- · Indigo leaves are dried and finely ground
- Each fabric is individually hand-dyed in 1 sqm bathtubs
- Dyeing sessions rounds last a minimum of 5 minutes
- · Washing reveals the full depth of indigo shades
- A Vitamin C-based fixative is added to lock in the colour
- Proper dehydration enhances colour richness and fixation

- 8 distinct shades of Indigo

- · So pure and safe that it is used in food and cosmetics
- Exceptional colour fastness thanks to Vitamin-C fixative.

PIPE ICING AND LAMÉ BLEACHING SPRAY STENCIL , SHIBORY AND ITAJUME DYEING

These are rare processes that deliver unparalleled garment visuals, harmonizing tradition with modern innovation

RAISE FIBER

A rare treatment used to develop rich, tactile textures in cashmere and other premium fibres, offering an extraordinary sensory experience.

SNOW FINISHING

A special melange dyeing technique that gives wool a snow-like appearance and nuanced textures that vary subtly with each piece.

CHEESE DYEING

With precise control over flow rate and winding density, this method ensures stable, high-quality dyeing for a wide range of materials, from polyester and nylon to wool, cotton, and blends

GRADATION DEYING

Executed entirely by hand, this technique creates elegant, flowing color gradations that machines cannot replicate—a true testament to artisanal craftsmanship and inimitable artistry.

FUR & FIM FINISHING

Exclusive to Japan, this process uses fabric texture and density, rather than mechanical brushing, to create a distinctive "fur" finish
